By completing and submitting this form, the exhibitor consents to information being used as described.

Only one item to be submitted per person per category.

- 1. All work must be that of the exhibitor.**
- 2. All exhibitors must be amateurs.**
- 3. All exhibits must not have been previously shown at the Country Heritage Park Annual Fair or it will not be judged as a result.**
- 4. No person shall enter more than one article per section.**

- 6. Items will be judged in accordance with the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAS) Judging Standards or the Ontario Horticultural Judging Standards.**
- 7. Items entered will be judged at the judge's discretion based on merit and judges are not obligated to award a 1st prize in any class. All judge's decisions are final.**
- 8. CHAS will not be responsible for any loss or postal disruptions in the delivery of the entries.**
- 9. All prize money is donated by the Country Heritage Agricultural Society unless otherwise stated.**
- 10. See specific Class Rules to avoid disqualification.**
